



# CURBSIDE RECYCLING GUIDELINES

Bins need to be placed curbside by 8:00 a.m. to ensure collection.

## CARDBOARD & PAPER

**RECYCLE:** Phone books, newspapers, magazines and inserts, catalogs, hardback books, paperback books, discarded mail, cereal boxes, soft drink cartons, cardboard, paper and gray board. Shredded paper.

**COLLECTION:** Remove inner materials and flatten. Flatten corrugated cardboard. Bag shredded paper.

## METAL

**RECYCLE:** Beverage cans, tin/steel cans, scrap metals, aluminum foil

**COLLECTION:** Empty contents

**NON-RECYCLABLE:** Paint cans, buckets

## GLASS

While we can not currently accept glass curbside due to COVID changes with the recycler, you can take glass to Target for recycling (the bin is near the snack bar)

## PLASTIC

**RECYCLE:** Plastic containers with the #1 or #2 insignia on the bottom of the following containers: milk bottles, laundry, bleach, and fabric softener containers, drink bottles such as water, juice, soda bottles, etc.

**COLLECTION:** Empty contents, Rinse.

ONLY THE PLASTICS LISTED ABOVE WILL BE ACCEPTED FOR RECYCLING.

***WE CANNOT ACCEPT FILM/BAG PACKING MATERIALS EVEN IF THEY HAVE A #1 OR #2 ON THEM. THE FACILITY DOES NOT ACCEPT "FLIMSY" PLASTICS.***

## BATTERIES

**RECYCLE:** Automobile batteries. Rechargeable and non-rechargeable household batteries

**COLLECTION:** Place in a sealed plastic bag. Automobile batteries need to be placed beside your recycle bin.

## APPLIANCES or LARGE HOUSEHOLD DONATIONS

**RECYCLE:** Household appliances: refrigerators, water heaters, dishwashers, stoves, washers and dryers, items for donation to Haven of Rest or Salvation Army

**COLLECTION:** Call for details to schedule collection.
